The Prince Hall Masonic Lodge #17 was first founded in Redlands but moved to San Bernardino by the 1920s. Early leaders founded the San Bernardino NAACP and laid the foundation of the Black community on San Bernardino's Westside.







Under the leadership of W.S. Johnson and John Lee, they formed the Westside Masonic Building Association in the 1920s to construct a large two-story brick building at the corner of 8th and Perris, which became a social, economic and political center of the community. Early businesses in the complex included the Harlem Café, a pool hall, a real estate agent, and Golden State Mutual Insurance.




