

FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF PERRIS

- In 1926, the First Baptist
 Church of Perris was
 officially incorporated.
- It was the first African
 American church in
 Perris
- Dora Nelson established the church



Dora Nelson

- Born in slavery in 1852,
 Dora Nelson moved to
 Perris, CA
- Nelson's family was one of the early Black families to settle in the area.

Dora's impact on the church

- Since there was no Black church for the local community, Dora began hosting prayer meetings in her home, located on F and Sixth Streets.
- The meetings outgrew her home, people began to gather in her yard under her China Berry tree. From this location, the First Baptist Church of Perris was established.
- As local ministers assisted with ministerial duties, credit wasn't given to Dora for establishing the church.

Preserving the Church's Historical Legacy



ALBERTA & CHARLES KEARNEY MOVED TO PERRIS IN 1957

- Living near the church they didn't know it's history until the city tore down the building
- She saved the doors to the church and soon began to document Black history in Perris
 - She created the Dora Nelson African American Art and History Museum in 1998 preserve our history
