Browns & Yeager Win Big, Carter Wins Easily In Rialto, Highland - S.B. County's Newest City, Upset In Riverside City Council Ward 7 Seat

Hardy Brown and Marlin Brown, incumbents on the San Bernardino School Board both led the pack and were re-elected to the seats Tuesday November 3. The third seat, elected, Lou Yeager, rounded out the three to be elected for the next four years. Also in the election the new city of Highland was incorporated and is the 18th city in the county.

Hardy Brown was the highest vote getter and led most of the evening in most returns counted. The final count was Hardy Brown 7,512; Marlin Brown 7,336; Lou Yeager 5,902; C.E. Tapie Rohm, Jr. 4,223; James McCambridge 2,969; Ed Baumgartner 2,783 and Valdez 2,792.

The new Highland city also

Hastings Remains Optimistic Despite Denial Of Access To Evidence

Embattled U.S. District Court Judge Alcee Lamar Hastings has reiterated that he will not be removed from office in spite of what other enemies might contrive during this period of tribulation.

"I am not under a rock," Hastings said in response to questions on the refusal by a federal appeals court to allow his access to "records, minutes, transcripts and exhibits" once used by a grand jury in his indictment. He was acquitted in 1983 of the bribery conspiracy charges.

Alarmed by the secretary surrounding proceedings of a House of Representative sub-

committee considering possible impeachment, Hastings initiated a court action asking for the release of the information of the grand jury investigations.

Earlier, senior U.S. Circuit Judge John D. Butzner refused to allow Hastings access to the evidence, saying that it would be turned over to the House Judiciary committee.

Rather than ask the court for the release, Butzner said Hastings should direct his request to the House subcommittee has urged the release of the 381-page report of the panel which recommended Hastings' impeachment.

The House's Criminal Justice Committee in an ex-

ecutive session last week, adopted the recommendation. Action by the entire Justice Committee is expected next week, the matter will then be sent to the General Assembly of all members of the House of Representatives.

Hastings recalled that since the impeachment proceedings against him began, he has not won anything, but he expressed confidence that, in the end, he will win.

He said that the secrecy employed by those investigating him implies that making the evidence public would be to his advantage.

"I still can request, demand, cajole and beg that all this evidence be made public," he said.

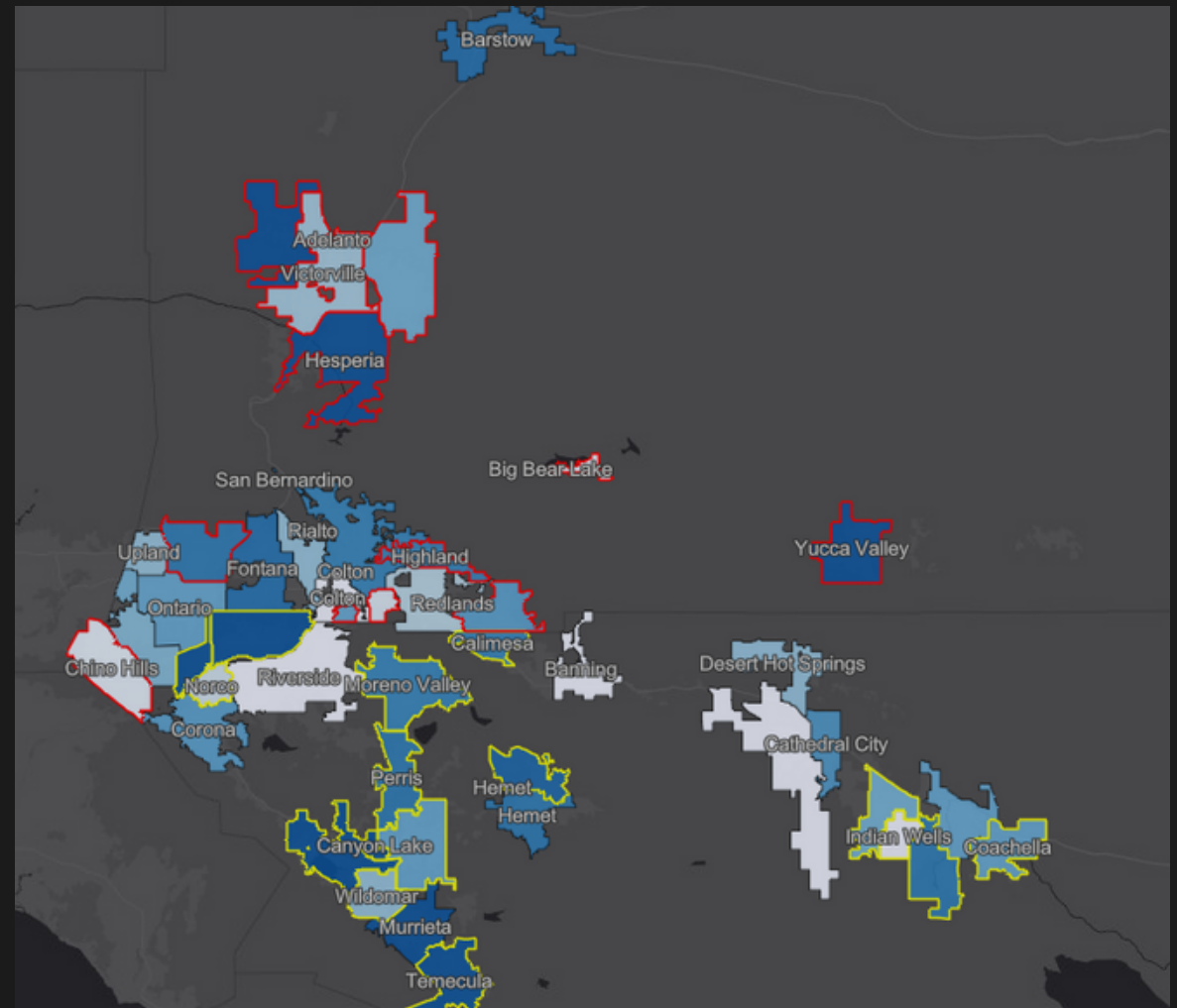
